- test new pages, new features, or new functionality of the Service to see how our users react to them.
- Targeting cookies: These cookies record your visit to our Online DSI Project Platform, the pages you have visited and the links you have followed. We will use this information to make our Online DSI Project Platform and the content displayed on it more relevant to you and your peers' interests. We may also share this information with third parties for this purpose.

from time to time use third-party cookies to help us understand usage statistics of
our sites and services, deliver advertisements of our other products and services on
and through our sites, for example.
